



Thinking of a new pellet or wood stove?

Up to **\$8,000*** off the cost to replace your old stove and weatherize your home!

Income-qualified homeowners are eligible for up to **\$4,800** off the cost to purchase and install a new pellet or wood stove, and up to **\$3,200** for weatherization measures like insulation and air sealing. Qualify for a free or reduced cost energy audit with HEAT Squad. Low interest loans are available from NeighborWorks of Western VT.

* Homeowners with non EPA-compliant cord wood stoves are eligible for up to \$4,800 off the cost towards the purchase and installation of a new, EPA-certified pellet or cord wood stove. Weatherization rebates include up to \$2,000 from Efficiency VT which are paid to homeowner after project is complete. 1. All heating systems incentivized by the program shall be EPA-certified and have an emission rating of particulate matter (of 2.5 microns in size) of no more than 2.0 grams per hour with a verified efficiency rating of at least 70%. Installation of new stoves and any central heating systems should be fueled with pellets. Exceptions can be made for cord wood stoves with prior approval, but the wood stoves shall meet the same emissions rating for particulate matter as the pellet stoves.
2. Old wood stoves to be replaced must be in use/usable, not EPA certified, or if certified manufactured before 1998 and not compliant with current EPA standards.
3. The stove retailer company must completely fill out the *Final Project Documentation and Rebate Request Form* and submit it to NeighborWorks of Western Vermont. The *Final Project Documentation and Rebate Request Form* includes certification that the stove that was replaced was eligible to be replaced, that the stove was removed from the residence, that the doors were removed, and that the stove has been destroyed/recycled by a participating recycling facility. The recycling facility must be noted on the *Final Project Documentation and Rebate Request Form*. The customer must review and sign the *Final Project Documentation and Rebate Request Form* to receive the rebate.
4. No rebates are available for systems installed prior to March 9, 2018.
5. Purchase, installation, and removal of old stoves must be completed by a participating stove retailer: The Stove Depot or Rutland Stove and Fireplace Company.
6. The customer is responsible to pay the stove retailer for the purchase price and installation costs of their new stove less the rebate amount. The rebate will be paid directly to the stove retailer and the rebate amount will be subtracted from the total cost of the project at time of purchase.
7. Customer must change out or install a new stove to be eligible for weatherization rebates from HEAT Squad. Weatherization rebates will be paid directly to the contractor and the rebate amount will be subtracted from the total cost of the weatherization project.
8. All rebates are based on household size and household income. By signing below, the customer is certifying to the best of their knowledge that the household information listed above is accurate.
9. The customer and retailer will forfeit the rebate if the customer or the retailer provides NeighborWorks of Western Vermont with false information or if the required information is not submitted prior to the expiration date listed below.
10. Applications are processed in the order they are received. Rebates will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis. Funding is limited, therefore rebates are not guaranteed. The rebates will only be valid until the expiration date listed below. The HEAT Squad Wood Stove Change-Out and Pellet Heating Program is subject to change.
11. NeighborWorks of Western Vermont and its service HEAT Squad, the Vermont Clean Energy Development Fund, the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources' Department of Environmental Conservation, and Green Mountain Power do not warranty any devices purchased under this program regarding the quality, functionality, or satisfaction of the device.
12. NeighborWorks of Western Vermont and the Clean Energy Development Fund will be conducting randomly selected site visits. Customers must provide staff access to their residence to inspect the new wood/pellet stove for compliance with program requirements, if requested. NeighborWorks of Western Vermont and the Clean Energy Development Fund will provide no less than 2 calendar days' notice prior to this inspection.
